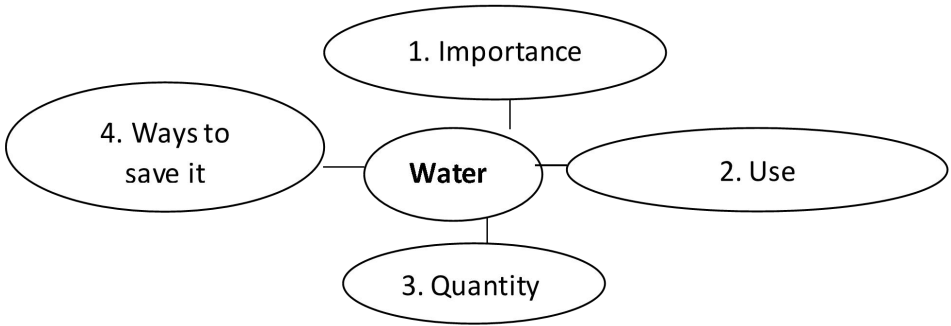

During the summer holiday, I was lucky enough to go to Chile (智利) in South America along with some of my schoolmates. We stayed with Chilean families there. We first meet them when they visited our school before. While we were there, we visited many parts of the country, including the Atacama Desert (阿塔卡玛沙漠) and Chile's capital city of Santiago.

At first, it was a bit difficult to live in a house with a new family. But I fit in well and my Spanish improved quickly. My trip to the Atacama Desert was an unforgettable experience. Not only did I see some incredible scenery, but I was also able to experience some unique things there. For example, I swam in Cejar Lagoon, an oasis(绿洲). Its salty water can help you float more easily. In addition, I saw wild flamingos, ate in a cafe at a height of 3,300 meters and climbed a mountain to see cave paintings that were created over 4,000 years ago.

I don't think I will ever forget the view that I got when I watched the sunset on top of the Purple

It seems that Sandra Oh just keeps“killing”it.



The 47-year-old Korean-Canadian actress co-hosted the 76th Golden Globe Awards last month in California, the US, becoming the first Asian woman to do so.

But Oh actually made history twice at the ceremony: She took home the Best Actress award for her role in BBC America's Killing Eve (《杀死伊芙》). The award made her the first Asian woman to win multiple Golden Globes.

Many people know Oh through Grey's Anatomy (《实习医生格蕾》). In the hit TV show, Oh plays a devoted doctor named Cristina Yang, who is a non-stereotypical (非传统的) Asian character. This role won Oh her first Golden Globe award.

In fact, Oh has long been devoted to portraying (塑造) real Asians to Western audiences. In Killing Eve, for example, Oh played a special agent called Eve Polastri, who hunts a killer named Villanele. Click the link to find out more about her characters.

“Her performance not only shows the changing attitudes of audiences toward diversity and inclusivity (包容性), it also shows that, in fact, an Asian woman's story can be art,” reporter Jackie Wong wrote on Medium (简书).

In her acceptance speech, Oh described the fact of her simply standing on the stage as a “moment of change”.

“I said ‘yes’ to the fear of being on this stage tonight, because I wanted to be here, to look out into this audience and witness this moment of change,” Oh said.

So Oh is not just killing it with her performance in Killing Eve and with her humorous hosting skills – she’s **killing it** in every possible way as an Asian woman.

Earlier this year, China achieved a new milestone in space exploration. On Jan.3rd, Chang’e became the first space probe in history to successfully land on the far side of the moon, People’s Daily reported.

From Earth, we can only see one side of the moon. The other side has been a mystery. Scientists have long wondered what lies on this side of the moon.

Chang’e 4 has sent back photos of the far side of the moon. It is also being used to carry out experiments, such as growing seeds in a low-gravity environment. The data collected from these experiments could be used to help us build a base on the moon in the future.

The success of the Chang’e 4 mission is a major achievement for China’s space program. **It** marks a new stage in China’s deep space exploration, said Wu Yanhua, deputy head of China National Space Administration.

China launched its lunar exploration program in 2004, naming it Chang’e. Chinese scientists set three goals - “orbiting (环绕运行) , landing and sample returning” - referring to launching probes that could circle around the moon, touch down on its surface and bring lunar materials back to Earth.

Chang’e 4 has realized the second goal. The third will be achieved during the Chang’e 5 mission, which is set to take place before the end of this year, China Daily reported.

Following the success of the Chang’e missions, Chinese scientists are looking even farther into our solar system. China’s first Mars mission is expected to be carried out by 2020, Wu said.

Which part of the world has the most nearsighted students? Just look around you— it’s East Asia. Nine in ten school leavers in major East Asian cities are nearsighted, according to the BBC. Experts say books and video games are not to blame. East Asian students, they say, aren’t getting enough sunlight.

People become nearsighted because their eyeballs grow out of shape and light entering their eyes cannot focus correctly. The body can produce a chemical called dopamine (多巴胺) to stop eyeballs from changing shape. And guess what scientists have just discovered? Sunlight can help our bodies produce more dopamine, reported AFP.

According to the study, primary school students in Singapore spend only 30 minutes outdoors every day; in Australia, by contrast, kids spend about three hours a day outside. As a result, fewer children in Australia are nearsighted – only 10 percent, compared with 90 percent in Singapore.
