(B)

A British explorer is claiming to be the first person to walk the length of the Yangtze River in China. Ash Dykes, from Old Colwyn in North Wales, finished the 6,437-kilometer journey by himself. The 28-year-old said he felt great after crossing the finish line in Shanghai, where he was greeted by his family, the media and Chinese supporters.

The expedition (探险) took them two years to plan and 352 days to complete. At the start of the walk, the destination(目的地) of the Yangtze River was difficult to reach and four members of his team left the expedition before it began because of altitude sickness. There were also fears over the possibility of bear and wolf attacks.

He said he wanted to use his journey to stress(强调) protection projects by partnering with the World Wide Fund for Nature, Green Development Foundation and Water to Go. The explorer said raising environmental awareness during the expedition makes it far more meaningful because he has a great love of the protection of the environment.

The idea of walking along the Yangtze River was planned after Dykes visited China in 2010 and he felt such a journey would take him to “the heart of the country.” Dykes said that the journey was not only about challenging himself but about meeting people along the way. “It was about the locals, the different cultures, customs and traditions. It has been amazing,” he said.

Nao, a small robot, looks like a person. If Nao begged you not to shut it off, what would you do? Would you follow its wishes?

Scientists did a research to see how people treat robots that act like people. Eight-nine people volunteered for the study. They were asked to help to improve Nao's social skills by finishing two tasks with it.

The tasks with the robot itself weren't important, though. What the scientists really wanted to see was how the participants(参与者) reacted as soon as the tasks were over. They were asked to talk with Nao and finally shut Nao off but it was not easy to do. Some people did not want to turn the robot off while others took a long time to do **it**.

People often communicate with non-human objects such as TVs and computers nowadays. But robots seem more like humans. Robots can show social characters themselves, like speaking in human voices or taking the shape of a human body. Scientists said people might see Nao's cries as a sign of independent thought. In turn, this could lead people to see the robot as human-like character.

For thousands of years, humans lived in a world where they were the only ones who could have conversations. Our brains learned to react to social situations in a certain way. But our brains are not used to telling the difference between real people and unreal people. The robot expressed feelings and desires and that got people to want to treat the robot as if it were alive.

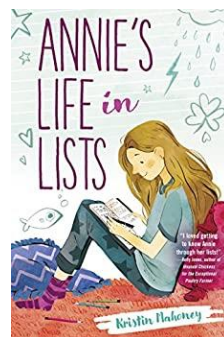

Or will her photographic memory get her into trouble?



Are the characters believable?

Annie's Life in Lists has believable characters. Annie is starting fifth grade now. At the same time, she has to adapt(适应) to a new town, home, school, and new friends. She has made a goal to overcome her shyness. Her new friend Zora and her family are among the few African Americans in Clover Gap. Annie also has a 12-year-old brother named Ted.
