The classic tale of Alice's Adventures in Wonderland (《爱丽丝梦游仙境》) is a book many children grow up with. It has been around for over 150 years.

In the story, the 7-year-old Alice is running after a white rabbit, but she accidentally 36 down a rabbit hole. She enters a world called Wonderland, and this is 37 the adventure (冒险) begins.

In Wonderland, there seems to be no rules or logic (逻辑). Alice meets many strange and wonderful characters. A cruel queen says she is going to 38 off someone's head every two minutes. A cat smiles so big that its lips (嘴唇) almost 39 its ears. And strange things happen to Alice too. Her body 40 and shrinks (缩小) during her time in Wonderland.





On January 27, in order to win COVID-19 Resistance War, the Ministry of Education issued (公布) a notice on putting off the start time of school in spring 2020. It was said that school should not start before March. 26. The exact start time of school will depend on situations and further notices.

However, many parents are very worried that putting off the start of school may affect children's studies. If they have such a long winter vacation, children won't learn any knowledge, read books or study at all. They may forget what they have learned before. Staying at home for a long time will make them keep eating, sleeping and playing, which seriously affect their physical and mental health.



In short, the close of school influences learning and develops bad habits, so how should we avoid these problems? Local education departments have also issued a notice, that is, to organize online teaching and create a network platform (平台), where necessary courses will be shown every day, and online teaching will be given by excellent teachers, and students can learn at home through computer or mobile network. It should be said that such a method is very good. It can not only keep students indoors and not worry about the infection of the disease, but also make them study at home, improve their learning ability, and truly achieve "no suspension of classes". Both the platform and the recorded lesson resources are more useful, and are welcomed by parents and teachers.

Of course, except for learning at home, it is also necessary to teach children about health knowledge, especially how to keep away from touching virus; at the same time, it is also necessary for children to do some physical exercises or some games, which is good for physical health at home.

Why do designers of fireworks like to put the biggest bang at the end? Why does a gymnast often show her best skill at the end of her performance? And why does the climax (高潮) of a movie usually come at the end instead of the beginning?

To answer these questions, you need to understand a rule in psychology first. It's called the "peak-end rule".

Please think about this: How do we usually judge (判定) a past event? Do we take an average of our happiness levels across the entire event? No. In fact, our memories are affected by the "peak-end rule". We don't remember all parts of the event equally. Instead, we only think of how the event was at the end and how it was at its "peak". That helps us decide whether we would like to experience the event again.

One of the most famous papers on the rule was published in 1993. Scientists asked a group of people to put their hand in freezing water. People had to keep their hand in the water for 60 seconds. Then, the same group of people was asked to do the same thing again. This time, however, they had to leave their hands in the water for 30 seconds longer while the temperature was raised a little bit. They were then asked which of the two experiences they would prefer to repeat.

You might think people would choose the first one. However, most people said they would like to repeat the second experience. They chose more pain over less, but with a happier ending.

So the next time you make a plan, plan for the best things to happen at the end. Don't worry if things don't go according to your plans. After all, you may not remember the bad bits!


