

Winston Churchill is probably the most popular British leader ever. What he had done against the Nazis is well known, while there are some facts about him that might surprise you.

A cigar (雪茄) in the mouth is a sign of Churchill. He developed his love of cigars when he traveled to Cuba as a young man. Later in his life, he smoked eight or nine cigars every day. However, he never really smoked, but held the cigar in his mouth until it went out, and then relighted it.

Churchill always had 3,000 to 4,000 cigars in his house. The story that best shows his love of cigars took place during World War II, when he made a special oxygen mask (氧气面罩) so that he could still smoke on the plane.

In December 1931, Churchill was on a late-night visit to his friend Bernard Baruch in New York when he almost died. While crossing the street, he was hit by a car. Churchill had only looked to the right when he wanted to cross. However, cars drive on opposite sides of the road in America and Britain. He directly walked into the way of the car. Churchill got hurt seriously on his chest and shoulder. He said he was directly responsible for the accident, telling the police that the driver made no mistake and to let him go.

Since he was just not allowed to drink alcohol (酒) then, Churchill managed to talk his doctor into writing a note which read "it is necessary for Winston Churchill to use the alcohol after this accident, especially at meal times".

Once upon a time, an ancient Chinese businessman surnamed (姓) Xin owned a small wine shop in Wuhan. He offered a poor guest a drink every day for free. Half a year later, the poor man used orange juice to draw a crane (鹤) on the wall to express his thanks. The amazing crane would dance if people cheered, so more and more guests came to Xin's wine shop to watch it. Later, Xin named his shop Yellow Crane Tower. This is a story about the famous Yellow Crane Tower on the top of Wuchang Sheshan Mountain.

On Dec. 16, 2016, a German version (版本) of this story came out in Munster, Germany. It was translated and rewritten according to the reading habits of German children.

Wu Kejian from the Yellow Crane Tower Park said German versions of Chinese stories were not common. "We decided to illustrate (插图) the story about the tower and make it easier for German people to understand traditional Chinese culture," Wu added.

Two German children said they loved the dancing crane in the book and that before reading this story, they only knew of the panda from the film *Kung Fu Panda*.

2016 has marked the cultural exchange (交流) between Chinese and German young people. The Munster government hopes the book can help increase cultural exchanges between the two nations and tell German children more about Chinese culture.

It has been a long terrible day. You suddenly notice your parents are busy on their phone. Your anger rises up but you've forgotten you did the same thing just yesterday. It's time to keep away from the smartphone, and turn off the computer or TV. Quite a few studies suggest that if people want to have happy family relationships, they need to stop using technology too often.

"I was surprised about a number of people saying that this happens at their home every day," says Sarah Coyne, who works in the department of family life at Brigham Young University.

In a new study, Coyne asked 143 families to answer questions about technology use and family relationships. She wanted to understand how technology breaks into our lives. Around 70% of them said using a mobile phone is harmful for communication among the family members. About 74% said that computers sometimes made their communication with their families worse.

The wives also said they fought more with their husbands, which made them feel bad about their relationships. What's worse, they even felt less satisfied with life.

While technology can cause a rift in a family relationship, it can also bring the family members together. A study recently finds that when people watch TV together they feel closer. Going online is the fastest way of hurting family relationships.

Even mobile phones can be helpful. In a study, Coyne finds that when people send each other nice messages, the relationship improves. When they send controversial (有争议的) ones, they may make the other person unhappy, or even angry.
