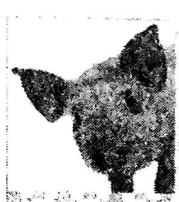

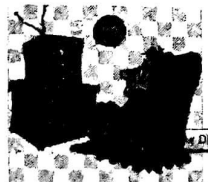

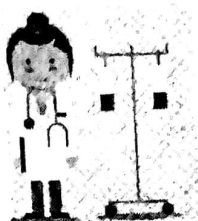

One day in March, seven years ago, during happy hours at a bar in my hometown of Fayetteville, Arkansas, I made a surprise announcement to my friends: I was going to shut down my law practice and try to travel around the earth in a year. What's more, I would do it without taking any flights or making a single advance reservation* of any kind. Some of my friends offered support and encouragement, while others were more doubtful. Once I had said the words, there was no turning back. I took months to shut down my law practice and get things in order. Once I set off on my adventure in December 2008, I found travelling without using planes was not easy. Trying to circle the earth in 16 months (it took me a bit longer than the 12 months I planned) made it even harder. Even so, travelling overland was the most amazing way to truly understand the beauty of our wonderful planet.

I took three overnight buses to travel 3,000 km through Argentina, from Ushuaia to the capital Buenos Aires. I would look out of the windows for hours continuously at the completely plains*, as if humans had never touched it.

It took seven days and nights on trains to get from Moscow to Beijing, each day spent staring out of the windows for hours as the Siberian plains swept by. Sometimes, I wouldn't see a village or a human being for 10 hours. Later in my journey, it took 22 days on a ship to get from New Zealand through the Panama Canal and back to Philadelphia, to finish my round-the-world adventure.

It turned out that travelling with no reservations was far less difficult than I had imagined. Pulling into a city on a bus with a backpack, looking in a guidebook for a few suggestions of places to live, and then finding an empty room was never much of a problem anywhere. It also open about all my travel plans, which is advice I give everyone who asks---plan for less than you think you should.

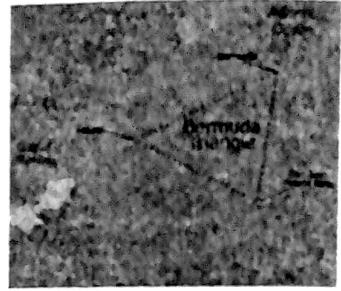

The Legendary Bermuda Triangle *: A Mystery No More

For years, people have believed that an area of the Atlantic Ocean between Bermuda, Puerto Rico and Florida, USA was a dangerous place. They thought planes and boats passing through here were likely to disappear. By 1964, a writer had called the area the "Bermuda Triangle". The name stuck, and so did the mystery.



In 1945, five US Navy planes, called Flight 19 took off from Florida and never came back. After they disappeared into the Bermuda Triangle, different ideas had begun to spread that the area was a dangerous place. Even before this famous flight, several ships had disappeared in these waters. People had many different ideas about why this happened. Some people even believed that a huge octopus* was responsible!

However, scientists believe that weather is part of the problem. Unusually shaped clouds above the area create strong winds that go down into the water, creating huge tsunami* waves that can take down boats or low-flying planes. And many researchers believe that there's no mystery at all. Ship goes down and plane accidents happen all over the world. It just seems to happen more in the Bermuda Triangle because there's more traffic.

The Bermuda Triangle is also one of the deepest areas of the Atlantic, with some areas being 8 km deep. So, remains are hard to find, which makes the disappearances seem even more mysterious.

In 2011, the Flight 19 planes were found, showing that they didn't completely disappear. But no matter how much evidence* there is that the Bermuda Triangle is no more dangerous than any other part of the ocean, many still believe that you mustn't go there.

"I'll help you find something for the little girl when I'm done with this," I said. Meghan left and went to her bedroom, and soon came back to me with Lucy, her much-loved doll. She stopped in front of the box for a moment, gave the doll a final kiss, then put it gently on top of the clothes.

"Oh, Honey," I said. "You don't have to give Lucy. You love her so much." Meghan nodded seriously, eyes glistening* with held-back tears. "Lucy makes me happy, Mommy. Maybe she'll make that other little girl happy, too."

I stared at Meghan for a long moment and didn't know what to say. For I suddenly realized that it's easy to give away things that we don't want any more, but harder to let go off things we cherish*, isn't it? True generosity is a three-year-old girl offering a valuable doll to a little girl she doesn't know in hope that it will bring this child as much pleasure as it brought her.
