

In recent years, the Swiss sportswear brand *On* has produced films that tell the stories of talented sportsmen. *Untethered* is one of the films. The 30-minute film tells the inspiring story of David Brown, the world's fastest blind runner. He was the Paralympic champion(残奥会冠军) and set a world record in 2014. He ran the 100-meter race in 10.92 seconds, becoming the first blind man in the world to do it under 11 seconds. However, David couldn't have done that without a man.

Because of an illness, David completely lost his eyesight when he was 13. But that never held him back. He loved sports and running soon became his favorite. To compete in big games, David found a running guide named Jerome Avery to partner with. Jerome is a talented runner himself. The two have been together since 2004. During races, they are connected by a cord(细绳). Yet it is friendship and shared experiences that join them together.

"I've put on the blinders(眼罩) and couldn't run more than three feet, let alone three meters," said Jerome. David lets go of all fears and puts his complete trust in Jerome. When you see Jerome and David run, it's like one person. Their inspiring story of companionship(友谊) and trust goes beyond(超过) the world of sport. In his free time, David cooks, climbs mountains and hikes. His life is full of laughs and he is excited about the future. As he says, "Your only limit (限制) is what you set for yourself."

According to David and his partner, this film will help people have a greater understanding of Paralympic sports. Don't miss it!

Good words are never lost. Not only will your good words bring sunshine to the lives of others, but also to yours. So remember to always be polite with your words.





When it comes to mysteries, many people will think of the Bermuda Triangle. As one of the most well-known mysteries of the modern age, this triangular-shaped area in the North Atlantic Ocean has caused a lot of people's interest. But do you know there is a place in China called the "Bermuda Triangle on Land"? It is the Paddle Maze(Mi Hun Dang) in Sichuan Province.

The Paddle Maze is located in the Wawu Mountain in Hongya County, Meishan City. The Wawu Mountain covers a large area and is home to lots of wild plants and animals. People used to go find herbs(药草) in the mountain, and some entered the Paddle Maze by accident. Those who set foot in the Paddle Maze often lost their way and some even disappeared. Compasses and watches could be out of order in the area. Even GPS fails to work there. As a result, people stay away from this area, and the local government doesn't allow visitors to enter the mysterious place.

As for the strange things that have happened in this area, people have lots of guesses. Some people believe that these things were caused by toxic(有毒的) gas in the forest. However, scientists found no toxins(毒素) in the air around the area. Others say that the chaotic(混乱的) magnetic field(磁场) in this area makes the tools fail. And the thick trees and special land forms(地貌) make it hard for people to find the direction. But there is no hard evidence(根据) for what has happened there.

At 00:23 on Oct 16, the Shenzhou XIII spacecraft rose into the sky. Three Chinese astronauts – Zhai Zhigang, Wang Yaping and Ye Guangfu – set off for the Tiangong space station.

During their six-month stay, they will set up robotic arms and do medical experiments, among other tasks. Wang Yaping will become the first Chinese woman to take a spacewalk.

It's not an easy job to do all these things. Chinese astronauts get difficult training before going to space. As People's Daily reported, all



the Chinese astronauts are excellent pilots with hundreds or even thousands of hours of flight time. They also receive hundreds of classes to prepare for space travel.

One of the hardest parts is the high-G training. It simulates (模拟) the environment when the spacecraft takes off. Sitting in a super-fast spinning (旋转) machine, astronauts' face muscles (肌肉) change shape. They cry tears as they spin. Blood can't flow to their brains properly, causing a lack of oxygen (氧气) and even blindness. Astronauts must operate (操作) the spacecraft under these conditions.

Another tiring exercise, as Wang Yaping told People's Daily, is the underwater training which lasts seven hours each time. It simulates a weightless (失重的) environment. She had to wear a 200-kilogram suit and do tasks in 10-meter-deep water without eating or going to toilet. After each training, Wang lost up to 2 kg of body weight.

"We may have to repeat such training every single day for years or decades," said Wang. "But there is no 'give up' in our dictionary."
