## B

During the Tang Dynasty, Emperor Taizong asked the prime minister Feng Deyi to look for talented people. However, several months passed, Feng didn't find anyone.

"I tried my best, but there are not unusual and well-rounded people at all," Feng said.

"People are like utensils (器物). What we need to do is to make good use of their strengths. You should blame (责怪) yourself for not noticing talented people. How could you say that there are no talented people in our country?" said the emperor.

It is really true that each utensil or tool has a specific use. A knife is made to cut things while chopsticks are made to pick up food. We can't use a knife as chopsticks. Like a utensil, each person has a special strength. Nobody is perfect. We can't expect a person to be good at everything.

With this idea in mind, Emperor Taizong discovered many talented people of different backgrounds. He offered them important positions, which helped them make the most of their talents. A good example is Ma Zhou, who grew up in a poor family. Ma gave a lot of useful advice, so Emperor Taizong offered him a position and promoted (晋升) him many times. Ma helped the emperor deal with difficult problems and became a famous person in history. During that period, the important officials around Emperor Taizong, such as Fang Xuanling, Wei Zheng, Li Jing, all were the brightest and the best of the time with their own strong points.

Emperor Taizong's talented people helped the society develop and created a "golden age".

## C

You might not expect it, but cows can lead to air pollution. Now scientists have shown that the pollution from cows can be cut by adding a little seaweed (海藻) to their food.

Cows have one stomach, but it has four separate parts. This allows them to process grass and other foods that humans can't digest (消化). One of their stomach parts has a special chemical. It helps break down the grass into something the cow's body can use. But the process produces lots of methane (甲烷), the world's second worst greenhouse gas.

Scientists first discovered that seaweed could help control methane from cows several years ago. But that work was done in a laboratory, and there were many questions about whether the idea could work in real life. In the lab studies, the cows were given some seaweed, and they ended up losing weight. That wasn't helpful, since cows are often sold by weight. It also wasn't clear if the seaweed would stop working if it was used for a longer period of time.

Now, scientists studied 21 cows on a farm for about five months. They mixed a little seaweed with the cows' food. The results were surprisingly good. Some cows produced 82% less methane. Even the worst-polluting cows produced 33% less methane. Over the five months, the scientists didn't see any signs that the cows' stomachs were getting used to the seaweed and starting to produce more methane again. Another good news came when they looked at the weight of the cows. The cows that were fed seaweed gained just as much weight as the other cows, but they didn't need as much food.

Although there are still some problems with the idea, it's very good news that something as simple as feeding cows seaweed can help reduce some of the pollution.

Making a meal is something like doing a science experiment. In the lab, scientists heat things up or mix them together to watch them change. When you heat or mix foods, they change, too. Scientists often follow instructions to do an experiment. So do cooks. Their instructions are called recipes. Like scientists, cooks also need tools. Tools help them warm, freeze (冷冻), mix, and mash.

	You're baking a cake. The recipe calls for a teaspoon of salt. But you don't know how much that is. No need to worry about it. Just take out some measuring (计量) tools. Measuring spoons help you figure out small amounts. Measuring cups help you figure out larger amounts.
	Cooks often mix foods. Mixing makes something new. For example, lots of different ingredients make up a salad. To make a salad, cooks use knives to cut up the ingredients. Then they use big spoons to toss (搅拌) everything together. Cooks also use a tool called a blender. It helps them mix tasty shakes.
	Heating or cooling food changes it, too. Most kitchens have two big tools for heating and cooling. Ovens heat food. Freezers cool it down. Good cooks always pay close attention to the temperature in the oven or the freezer, and also need to know how long to heat food. A timer is a good tool for that. If you set a timer when you put something in the oven, the alarm will go off when the food is ready.
	

When the cooking is done, the experiment is over. Forks, spoons and knives help us cut and pick up food. Without them, we'd have to eat with our fingers. That would be messy!
