

Nowadays, one of the great challenges of caring for children is the roadblock (路障) caused by the learner driver. When you look at the night sky, what you see are actually lots of "power plants". Every star can make a huge amount of energy through nuclear fusion (核聚变). For years, scientists have tried to make this kind of energy. They need to make a "mini star" on Earth. Recently, some scientists made a big step forward.

In February, the Culham Centre for Fusion Energy in Oxfordshire, UK, doubled a world record made in 1997. The machine there, named Jet, used fusion engines(发动机) to make the same amount of energy as four wind turbines(涡轮机) make, reported The Guardian.

In the past, no experiment could make more energy than what was used to start the fusion engine. This new experiment, although only lasting five seconds, showed it's possible to make more power.

The reaction stopped when the equipment got too hot. This problem can be solved with cooling systems. Future fusion reactions may last much longer than five seconds—minutes or even hours.

Why do we care so much about star power? Fusion reactions would provide power for everyone on Earth—enough for everyone to use for thousands or millions of years. They're also clean – they don't produce pollutions.

You may wonder why fusion energy is so hard to make. Creating conditions similar to a star is not easy. The machine must reach temperatures as high as 10 times that of the sun.

Even so, it's time to get excited about star power.

Dreams and goals are important because they give us a ruler against which to measure our progress. But progress, not meeting a goal, is what brings true happiness.

After winning the silver medal in women's single figure skating at Beijing 2022, Alexandra Trusova was heard screaming that she hated the sport. Even the gold medalist,



Anna Shcherbakova, said that “this has been what I’ve been working toward every day...” You can feel in her words the emptiness in her heart.

This kind of pressure might be difficult for you to imagine. After all, you probably aren’t an Olympic athlete. But have you ever connected your happiness to a far-off goal that you could achieve only by putting great efforts into it? Maybe it’s finishing a degree or gaining a certain amount of income.

Researchers have found that satisfaction is brought about not by big wins, but rather by making progress in meaningful work.

Some researchers have argued that when a goal is the final point for progress, the sudden stop is the process of forward can lead to a feeling of emptiness, which is exactly what Shcherbakova described in Beijing. This doesn’t mean that you should give up all goals, however. You just need to understand and pursue them in different ways.

- Enjoy the journey not the destination. Instead of chasing a goal with a single eye, think more on about whether you’re getting anything out of your progress right now.
- Think about the purpose of your goals. The point of a useful goal is to improve your quality of life by changing, not to limp(艰难地移动) across the finish line and stop after a difficult challenge.
- Take one step at a time. Researchers have found that common, small achievements help to start a cycle of success and happiness much more than rare, big ones. Make sure you can break your long-term goals into smaller tasks. Enjoy the daily and weekly achievements that you know are leading you down the road to success.
