Robert Titterman is a lawyer. In his free time, he goes on stage (舞台) beside pianist Maria Raspopova – not as a pianist but as her page turner. “I’m not a pianist, but I’ve learned to read music so I can help Maria in her performance.”

Mr. Titterman is chairman of the Omega Ensemble. However, he has been the group’s page turner for the past four years. His job is to sit beside the pianist and turn the pages of the score (乐谱) so the pianist doesn’t have to break the sound of music by doing it themselves. He said he became just as nervous as pianists on stage.

“A lot of skills are needed for the job. You have to make sure you don’t turn two pages at once and make sure you find the repeats in the music when you have to go back to the right page,” Mr. Titterman explained.

Being a page turner requires lots of practice. Some pieces of music can go for 40 minutes and require up to 50 page turns, including back turn for repeat passages. Silent (沉默的) onstage communication is key, and every pianist has their own way to ask for a page turn which Maria and Mr. Titterman has practiced with each other.

But like all performances, there are moments when things go wrong. "I was turning the page to get ready for the next page, but suddenly the pages fell off the stand," Mr. Titterman said. "Luckily I caught them and put them back."

Most page turners are piano students, although Maria has once asked her husband to help her on stage.

"My husband is the worst page turner," she laughed. "He enjoyed the music so much that he forgot to turn the pages! Robert is the best page turner I've had in my life."

The strawberry has been an interesting and important food throughout history. The fruit itself can go bad very easily and quickly and would be difficult to keep, but fossilized (石化的) strawberry seeds have been found. This discovery means that the strawberry has been with us for a very long time.

Two thousand years ago, the Greeks were praising the strawberry for its special qualities. These included cleansing the blood! In addition, strawberries were said to produce a calm feeling on a person and were often said to calm angry people. Quite a powerful job for a handful of strawberries!

Strawberries were common in the American Indians' food. Indians used strawberries and some other things to make strawberry bread.

The planting of strawberries began from the 1400s. However, at first, it wasn't for the delicious taste of the fruit. In the Middle Ages, people ate the strawberry leaves or put them in a tea to keep away bad dreams.

In the 1500s, the English used strawberry to make special food to deal with a large number of problems such as bad breath and bone problems. At the same time, in other parts of the world, people made strawberry drinks or put them onto the skin to deal with leprosy (麻风病).

For hundreds of years, people have believed that strawberries are helpful with women's skin. Although many woman are disappointed when the strawberry cream could not remove the freckles (雀斑). This isn't surprising, since the strawberry is made up of 90% water. However, it is very rich in vitamins C, B1, and B2, and the mineral iron.

Today, there are over 1,000 different kinds of strawberries, and the United States leads the world in strawberry production.

A lot of people think that adolescence (青春期) is the time when children go off exercise. But a study in Britain suggests it happens much earlier, around the age of seven.

Children should get at least an hour of exercise a day. Many of the 400 children in the study did less than this as they got older. The researchers from Newcastle tracked (监测) the activity levels of the children over eight years.

On average, boys spent 75 minutes a day exercising when they were seven, falling to 51 minutes when they were 15. The average girl spent 63 minutes a day doing middle to high levels of activity when they were seven, which fell to 41 minutes age 15. Most boys and girls in the study did middle levels of exercise at seven, which then gradually dropped (逐渐下降). But 20% of the boys who started with the highest levels of activity at the age of seven, managed to keep their exercise levels over the eight years.

Although the study cannot prove why the level of exercise drop, activity, Prof John Reilly, said “something is going wrong in British children” long before adolescence. He said it happened at the same time with the greatest increases in weight – which happen around the age of seven.

However, another different research on the same group of children found that the time lost to exercise was spent sitting instead. Sitting is replacing (代替) physical activity from the time children start school.

Children aged 7 spent half their day sitting, and by the age of 15 this had gone up to three-quarters of their day spent sitting.

“Activity time drops from around the time of going to school, when there’s a change in lifestyle,” Prof Reilly said. “There should be more activity breaks to break up long periods of sitting.”

But he also said that activities outside school – for example, at home – was also important because children only spent half of their year at school.

Eustace de Sousa, the head of Public Health England, said, “About 20% children leave school overweight. It’s up to all of us to make sure that children get their one hour of physical activity a day.”

Reading with Rover is a reading program where children read to dogs. In addition to Reading with Rover, which is based on Washington state, there are many other reading programs around the country. The goal of all these programs is to improve the reading skills of children with reading problems by having children read to dogs.

When reading aloud in the classroom, many children with reading problems and poor reading skills feel frightened. They have little confidence in themselves and are afraid of being laughed at. They may also feel that reading is difficult, boring and stressful (有压力的). However, when children read to dogs, reading becomes a fun experience for both the children and the dogs. Dogs don't judge or laugh at the children's reading ability.

Reading with Rover and other programs like it have been a huge success, resulting in improved reading skills for a large number of children with reading problems. In addition to making learning enjoyable, when children read to dogs, it increases their sense of worth and self-confidence.

As part of the Reading with Rover program, the children read to dogs that are special dogs. These are dogs that have been trained and tested. Along with their owners, these dogs have become therapy (治疗) teams.

A recent research study from the University of California showed that when children read to dogs, it can increase their reading skills by 30%.

Children who took part in this study said, "I feel relaxed when I am reading to a dog because I am having fun." "The dogs don't care if you read really badly so you just keep going."

When children read to dogs and improve their reading skills, it becomes just another example of how wonderful dogs are and how important they are to our society.
